White Rose Witness for the Right to Life in Dobbs v. Jackson

A decision from the U.S. Supreme Court in Dobbs v. Jackson is expected in June, and the U.S.

bishops have called for renewed prayer and fasting that this decision would overturn Roe v.

Wade. Our parish will offer a special Mass for Giving Thanks to God for the Gift of Human Life at 6 p.m. on Wednesday, June 1. Everyone is invited to join in prayer and fasting on that day for the legal protection of all human life – from conception to natural death. As a symbol of public witness to the beauty of all human life, please also wear white rose or an image of a white rose (such as a pin, sticker or patch) throughout the day on June 1. Wear this rose when at work, at the store, with family or friends – wherever you go. When asked why you are wearing it, consider giving a simple statement in these or similar words:

"I am wearing this rose because I support the right to life from the moment of conception, and because I hope the Supreme Court will overturn Roe v. Wade and save the lives of countless unborn children. It is important that we all pray for a conversion of hearts so that everyone in our community might come together to protect and support both mother and child at every stage of life."

White Rose Witness for the Right to Life in *Dobbs v. Jackson*

June 1, 2022

Background

- A decision in *Dobbs v. Jackson* is expected in June, and the U.S. bishops have called for prayer and fasting that this decision would overturn *Roe v. Wade*.
- In response, the Office of Family Life invites all parishes to renew the White Rose Witness on **Wednesday, June 1, 2022**.



How to Participate

- Offer a **Mass** or a **Holy Hour** on June 1 for the intention of legal protection of the right to life of all unborn children.
 - *Bishop Jugis has given permission for priests to celebrate the Mass "For Giving Thanks to God for the Gift of Human Life" (no. 48/1 of the Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions).*
- **Pray and fast** on that day for the legal protection of all human life – from conception to natural death.
- Wear a **white rose** in a visible place on your clothing throughout the day on June 1.
 - *When asked about the rose, please share this message: "I am wearing this rose because I support the right to life from the moment of conception, and because I hope that the Supreme Court will overturn Roe v. Wade and save the lives of countless unborn children. It is important that we all pray for a conversion of hearts so that everyone in our community might come together to protect and support both mother and child at every stage of life."*
