Dear Parishioners:

It is hard this time of year not to notice that the sun sets sooner and rises later.

Perhaps our drive home from work is becoming steadily darker, or our morning routine can no longer be carried out without the aid of a lamp. Our bodies likely notice this seasonal shift because we long for sunlight and need it for our physical health.

So, too, our minds and souls may be longing for light. Every person is likely confronting some sort of darkness. It may be very tangible darkness like sickness or the loss of a job or a broken relationship. Perhaps it is a more creeping darkness, such as the pressure of being constantly busy, the challenge of forming your children in virtue, or the difficulty of building authentic friendships in a world geared toward the superficial. This internal darkness can weigh more heavily this time of year as well.

This season, then, is a season marked by the growing light of the candles. As we enter

into this holy season, we must be watchers, searching for these lights, eagerly awaiting the dawn. This is not simply a time for shopping and parties. Jesus warns us about such activity and the blindness it can produce. Instead, he calls us to be attentive and ready in a fundamentally different way. We are invited to allow Christ to bring his light to our darkness. We are called to stay awake to God who draws near.

Estimados feligreses:

Es difícil en esta época del año no notar que el sol se oculta más temprano y sale más tarde.

Quizás nuestro camino a casa desde el trabajo se está volviendo cada vez más oscuro, o nuestra rutina matutina ya no se puede llevar a cabo sin la ayuda de una lámpara. Es probable que nuestros cuerpos noten este cambio estacional porque anhelamos la luz del sol y la necesitamos para nuestra salud física. Así también, nuestras mentes y almas pueden estar anhelando la luz. Es probable que cada persona se encuentre a algún tipo de oscuridad. Puede ser una oscuridad muy tangible como la enfermedad o la pérdida de un trabajo o una relación rota.

Quizás sea una oscuridad más sigilosa, como la presión de estar constantemente ocupado, el desafío de formar a tus hijos en la virtud, o la dificultad de construir amistades auténticas en un mundo orientado a lo superficial.
