Pastor's Message

Dear Parishioners:

Peace be with you. In this short passage of four verses, Jesus says those four words twice. Not only are these words repeated, but the gospel passage itself is also a "repeat." We heard this particular Scripture on a Sunday just a few weeks ago. There must be an important message here. The Gospel reminds us that on Easter night, Jesus' Apostles were filled with fear. The room was locked for fear of the Jewish leaders who had conspired with the Romans to kill Jesus and who the Apostles feared were after them next. Jesus enters into that fear, and then he offers them his peace, which is tied to his gift of the Holy Spirit. We have received this same Holy Spirit; we already have this precious gift of God within us. It's not a distant spiritual reality. It's not some confusing theological concept on which we need extensive instruction. Jesus, who remains with us in his word, in his body and blood in the Eucharist, in the church, continues to pour out his gift of the Holy Spirit upon us. He has promised that he will never leave us. He has promised that he will continue to do tremendous deeds through each and every one of us who make up the Church. But it's still a matter of choice, a decision on our part. We must want the Holy Spirit. We must want his peace.



Scripture Readings

First Reading: And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim. (Acts 2, 4)

Second Reading: For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit.
(2 Cor 12,13)

Psalm: Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth. (Ps 104)

Gospel: Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit." (Jn 20, 21-22)

Mensaje del parroco

Estimados feligreses:

La paz esté con ustedes. En este breve pasaje de cuatro versículos, Jesús dice esas cuatro palabras dos veces. No sólo se repiten estas palabras, sino que el mismo pasaje del evangelio es también una "repetir." Escuchamos esta Escritura un domingo hace apenas unas semanas. Debe haber un mensaje importante aquí. El Evangelio nos recuerda que en la noche de Pascua, los Apóstoles de Jesús se llenaron de miedo. La habitación estaba cerrada por temor a los líderes judíos que habían conspirado con los romanos para matar a Jesús, y los Apóstoles temían que los persiguieran después. Jesús entra en ese miedo y luego les ofrece su paz, que está ligada a su don del Espíritu Santo. Nosotros hemos recibido este mismo Espíritu Santo; ya tenemos este precioso don de Dios dentro de nosotros. No es una realidad espiritual lejana. No es un concepto teológico confuso en el que necesitamos una instrucción extensa. Jesús, que permanece con nosotros en su palabra, en su cuerpo y sangre en la Eucaristía, en la iglesia, sigue derramando sobre nosotros su don del Espíritu Santo. Él ha prometido que nunca nos dejará. Él ha prometido que seguirá haciendo grandes obras a través de todos y cada uno de los que formamos la Iglesia. Pero sigue siendo una cuestión de elección, una decisión de nuestra parte. Debemos desear el Espíritu Santo. Debemos desear su paz.
