Pastor's Message

Dear Parishioners:

We are nearing the end of the Easter season, and our gospel passage today from John is Jesus' prayer to the Father before his passion. Jesus knows what lies ahead for him, and this prayer reflects what is in his heart. Even though he is facing brutal suffering, Jesus prays not for his benefit or relief from pain but for those he loves: I pray for them. I do not pray for the world but for the ones you have given me because they are yours, and everything of mine is yours, and everything of yours is mine, and I have been glorified in them. His prayer for us is that his mission might be fulfilled.

Gathered here today; we know that the small group mentioned in this passage has turned into millions and millions throughout the world for centuries. This is the power of living one's life to glorify God. During the remainder of the Easter season, may we continue to grow in the light of Christ that has been revealed to us. May we continue to grow in our understanding of God's love for us, especially in what we celebrate at the Eucharistic table.

Estimados feligreses:

Nos estamos acercando al final de la temporada de Pascua, y nuestro pasaje evangélico de hoy de Juan es La oración de Jesús al Padre antes de su pasión.

Jesús sabe lo que le espera, y esta oración refleja lo que está en su corazón. Incluso aunque se enfrenta a un sufrimiento brutal, Jesús no ora por su propio beneficio o alivio de dolor, pero por los que ama: oro por ellos. Yo no oro por el mundo sino por los que me has dado, porque son tuyos, y todo lo mío es tuyo y todo lo tuyo es mío, y en ellos he sido glorificado. Su oración es por nosotros, que su misión podría ser cumplida. Reúnanse aquí hoy, sabemos que el pequeño grupo mencionado en este pasaje se ha vuelto en millones y millones en todo el mundo durante siglos. Este es el poder de vivir la vida para glorificar a Dios.
