Dear Parishioners:

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, the central mystery of our Christian faith. We believe in a triune God: one God, two natures, three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The doctrine of the Trinity is not only the "central mystery of our faith and life" but is also "the source of all the other mysteries of faith." In celebrating the Trinity, the Church is not simply laying out a doctrine of complex theology. It is bringing to the forefront what ought to be the foundational principle of our lives: God is love; he made us for love; and strengthening and consoling us in times of challenge and trial, empowering us to be his disciples. This love is so real that Christ was willing to die for us. Are we not invigorated by the greatest of loves to proclaim to the world that we love God and our neighbor, just as he loves us? Today, let us revel in that divine love and let it permeate our lives.

Estimados feligreses:

Hoy celebramos la Solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad, misterio central de nuestra fe cristiana. Creemos en un Dios Trino: un Dios, dos naturalezas, tres personas; padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo. La doctrina de la Trinidad no es sólo el “centro misterio de nuestra fe y de nuestra vida”, sino que es “la fuente de todos los demás misterios de la fe. Hoy, deleitémonos en ese amor divino y dejemos que impregne nuestras vidas.
