Second: Brothers and sisters: The Levitical priests were many because they were prevented by death from remaining in office, but Jesus, because he remains forever has a priesthood that does not pass away. Therefore, he is always able to save those who approach God through him, since he lives forever to make intercession for them. It was fitting that we should have such a high priest: holy, innocent, undefiled, separated from sinners, higher than the heavens. He has no need, as did the high priests, to offer sacrifice day after day, first for his own sins and then for those of the people; he did that once for all when he offered himself.([Heb 7:23-28](#))


Gospel: One of the scribes came to Jesus and asked him, "Which is the first of all the commandments?" Jesus replied, "The first is this: *Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.* The second is this: *You shall love your neighbor as yourself.* There is no other commandment greater than these." The scribe said to him, "Well said, teacher. You are right in saying, 'He is One and there is no other than he.' And 'to love him with all your heart, with all your understanding, with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself' is worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices." And when Jesus saw that he answered with understanding, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." And no one dared to ask him any more questions. ([Mk 12:28b-34](#))




Pastor's Message

Dear Parishioners:

Which is the first of all the commandments? This question, posed to Jesus by a scribe in today's Gospel, has us thinking that this might be another "test" by a learned Jewish scholar. In fact, the Gospel of Matthew explicitly calls it such (Mt 22, 35), and it appears within the context of several such tests by the Pharisees and scribes. But the Gospel we read today is Mark's and his account of this exchange is much more collegial, and he does not call it a test.

In answering this question, Jesus reinforces that God's law is a law of love. It is not a weapon to condemn or instill fear and anxiety, but rather is intended for our wellbeing. It is both a prescription and a description: God loves and cares for us, and we are to love and care for one another. This is how Jesus teaches us to understand and use the law, and when we do, we come closer together to the kingdom of God's love and peace, the foretaste of which we share in this Eucharist.

Mensaje del parroco

Estimados feligreses:

¿Cuál es el primero de todos los mandamientos? Esta pregunta, planteada a Jesús por un escriba en el Evangelio de hoy, nos hace pensar que podría tratarse de otra “prueba” de un erudito judío. De hecho, el Evangelio de Mateo la llama explícitamente así (Mt 22, 35), y aparece en el contexto de varias pruebas de este tipo realizadas por los fariseos y los escribas. Pero el Evangelio que leemos hoy es el de Marcos y su relato de este intercambio es mucho más colegial, y no lo llama prueba.
Al responder a esta pregunta, Jesús refuerza que la ley de Dios es una ley de amor. No es un arma para condenar o infundir miedo y ansiedad, sino que está destinada a nuestro bienestar. Es a la vez una prescripción y una descripción: Dios nos ama y cuida, y nosotros debemos amarnos y cuidarnos unos a otros. Así es como Jesús nos enseña a entender y usar la ley, y cuando lo hacemos, nos acercamos más al reino del amor y la paz de Dios, cuyo antílope compartimos en esta Eucaristía.
