Scripture Readings

First Reading: Moses was tending the flock of his father-in-law Jethro, the priest of Midian. Leading the flock across the desert, he came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There an angel of the LORD appeared to Moses in fire flaming out of a bush. As he looked on, he was surprised to see that the bush, though on fire, was not consumed. So Moses decided, "I must go over to look at this remarkable sight, and see why the bush is not burned."

When the LORD saw him coming over to look at it more closely, God called out to him from the bush, "Moses! Moses!" He answered, "Here I am." God said, "Come no nearer! Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place where you stand is holy ground. I am the God of your fathers, "he continued, "the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, the God of Jacob." Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look at God. But the LORD said, "I have witnessed the affliction of my people in Egypt and have heard their cry of complaint against their slave drivers, so I know well what they are suffering. Therefore I have come down to rescue them from the hands of the Egyptians and lead them out of that land into a good and spacious land, a land flowing with milk and honey." Moses said to God, "But when I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' if they ask me, 'What is his name?' what am I to tell them?" God replied, "I am who am." Then he added, "This is what you shall tell the Israelites: I AM sent me to you." God spoke further to Moses, "Thus shall you say to the Israelites: The LORD, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, the God of Jacob, has sent me to you. "This is my name forever; thus am I to be remembered through all generations." (Exodus 3:1-8a, 13-15)

Psalm: The Lord is kind and merciful. (Psalm 103: 1-2, 3-4, 6-7, 8, 11.) **Second:** I do not want you to be unaware, brothers and sisters, that our ancestors were all under the cloud and all passed through the sea, and all of them were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea. All ate the same spiritual food, and all drank the same spiritual drink, for they drank from a spiritual rock that followed them, and the rock was the Christ. Yet God was not pleased with most of them, for they were struck down in the desert. These things happened as examples for us, so that we might not desire evil things, as they did. Do not grumble as some of them did, and suffered death by the destroyer. These things happened to them as an example, and they have been written down as a warning to us, upon whom the end of the ages has come. Therefore, whoever thinks he is standing secure should take care not to fall. (1 Corinthians 10:1-6, 10-12)

Gospel: Some people told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with the blood of their sacrifices. Jesus said to them in reply, "Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were greater sinners than all other Galileans? By no means! But I tell you, if you do not repent, you will all perish as they did! Or those eighteen people who were killed when the tower at Siloam fell on them— do you think they were more guilty than everyone else who lived in Jerusalem? By no means! But I tell you, if you do not repent, you will all perish as they did!" And he told them this parable: "There once was a person who had a fig tree planted in his orchard, and when he came in search of fruit on it but found none, he said to the gardener, 'For three years now I have come in search of fruit on this fig tree but have found none. So cut it down. Why should it exhaust the soil?'(Luke 13:1-9)

Pastor's Message

Dear Parishioners:

In today's second reading, Paul is clear that we should not be overconfident in ourselves. He writes, whoever thinks he is standing secure should take care not to fall. He cautions against presumptuousness be comparing the Corinthians to the Israelites during the Exodus who, despite their newfound freedom, grumbles against God as soon as things got tough. He wants them to understand that the things that happened to their ancestors await them if they, too, desire evil things At the end of the day, our confidence rests not in ourselves but in our God who is faithful. This God has indeed come down to rescue us, as foretold to Moses through the burning bush. We return to the Eucharistic table each week, perhaps daily, to be reminded of this truth. For on



this table God shows up and stands strong, no matter how weak or unstable we ourselves may feel. We cling to Christ, confident in God's faithfulness to this good creation.

Estimados feligreses:

En la segunda lectura de hoy, Pablo deja claro que no debemos confiarnos demasiado. Escribe: quien crea estar seguro, tenga cuidado de no caer. Advierte contra la presunción al comparar a los corintios con los israelitas durante el Éxodo, quienes, a pesar de su recién descubierta libertad, se quejaron de Dios en cuanto las cosas se pusieron difíciles. Quiere que entiendan que las cosas que les sucedieron a sus antepasados les esperan si ellos también desean el mal. Al final, nuestra confianza no reside en nosotros mismos, sino en nuestro Dios fiel. Este Dios ha descendido para rescatarnos, como se le predijo a Moisés mediante la zarza ardiente. Regresamos a la mesa eucarística cada semana, quizás a diario, para recordar esta verdad. Porque en esta mesa Dios se manifiesta y se mantiene firme, sin importar cuán débiles o inestables nos sintamos. Nos aferramos a Cristo, confiados en la fidelidad de Dios a esta buena creación.
