Pastor's Message

Dear Parishioners:

The phrase: "See something, say something" has worked its way into our vocabulary. Originally, it was meant to encourage anyone to speak immediately if they saw something out of the ordinary, something that could harm others, something that was a threat. "See something, say something: was a way of encouraging everyone to be aware and say something. How have we seen the goodness of Christ in our lives? When we experienced his mercy and healing? How have his words offered us hope, given us direction, changed our lives? This is what we "see", and like Peter, John, and the other disciples, we are encouraged to say something about it to others, we are encouraged to give witness as we are able, to be leaven to help lift others up in the power of Christ's resurrection.

La frase: "Si ves algo, di algo" se ha instalado en nuestro vocabulario. Originalmente, su propósito era animar a cualquiera a hablar de inmediato si veía algo fuera de lo común, algo que pudiera dañar a otros, algo que representara una amenaza. "Si ves algo, di algo": era una forma de animar a todos a ser conscientes y decir algo. ¿Cómo hemos visto la bondad de Cristo en nuestras vidas? ¿Cuándo experimentamos su misericordia y sanación? ¿Cómo sus palabras nos han dado esperanza, nos han dado dirección y han cambiado nuestras vidas? Esto es lo que "vemos", y al igual que Pedro, Juan y los demás discípulos, se nos anima a decir algo al respecto a los demás, a dar testimonio según nuestras posibilidades, a ser levadura que ayude a otros a elevarse en el poder de la resurrección de Cristo.

Scripture Readings

First Reading: Peter proceeded to speak and said: "You know what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree. This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people, but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name." (Acts 10:34a, 37-43)

Psalm: This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad. (Psalm 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23)

Second: Brothers and sisters: If then you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory. (Colossians 3:1-4)

Gospel: On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead. (John 20:1-9)

When the church and Mont Olive's house (father's house) parking spots are full, people can park at the Grace Lutheran Church at 115 Unity St or at the Finch Auditorium at 406 Unity St. There will be people helping with the transportation from these places to the church. When the Stations of the Cross is over, the Spanish communion service will take place (around 2 p.m.). The English Communion Service will be at 6 p.m. **Holy Saturday/ Easter Vigil:** Bilingual Mass at 8:30 p.m. You can bring your candles & water to be blessed that day. White clothing is suggested for this mass. **Easter Sunday:** regular mass schedule.
